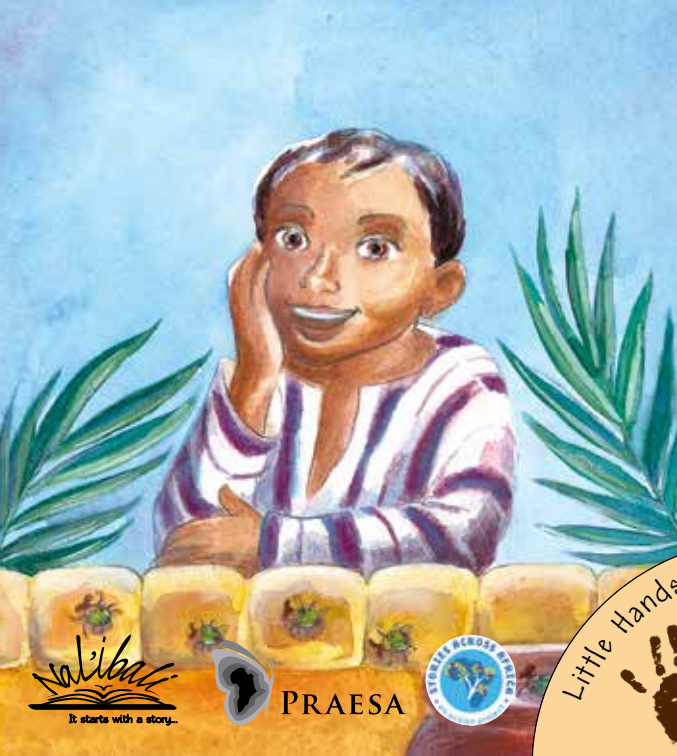
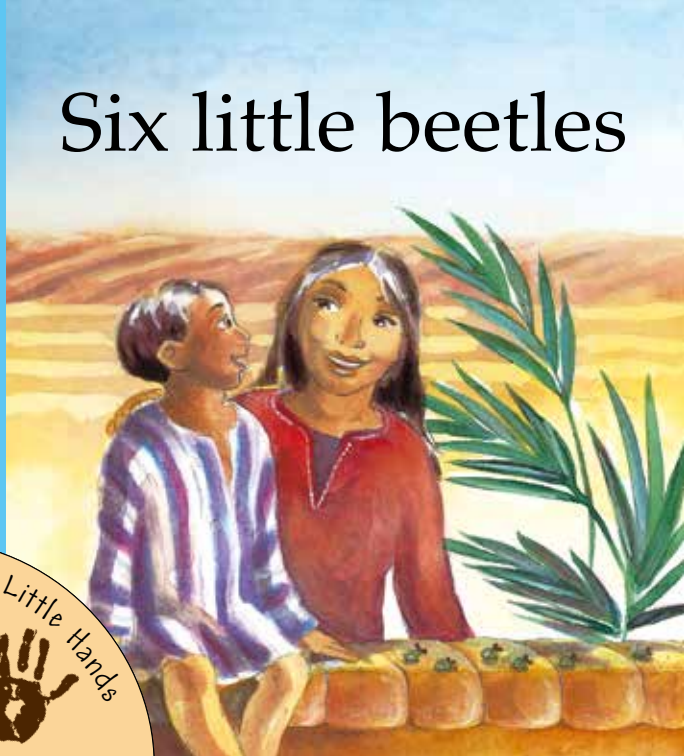

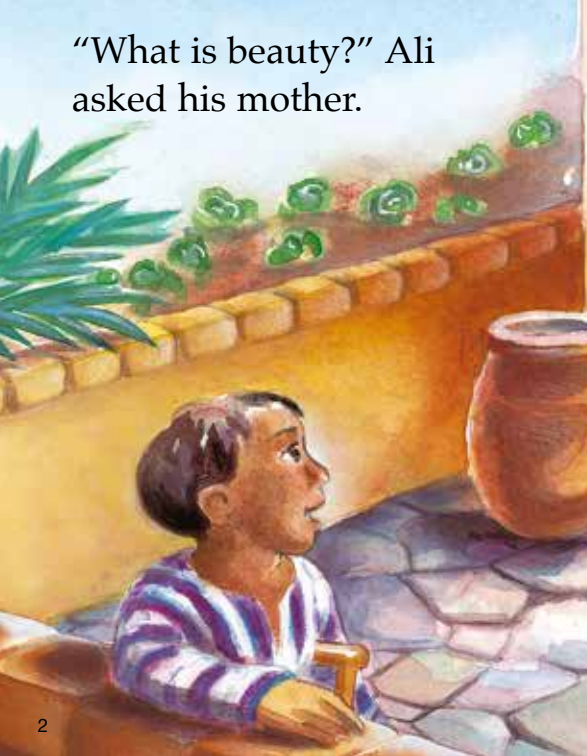
Six little beetles

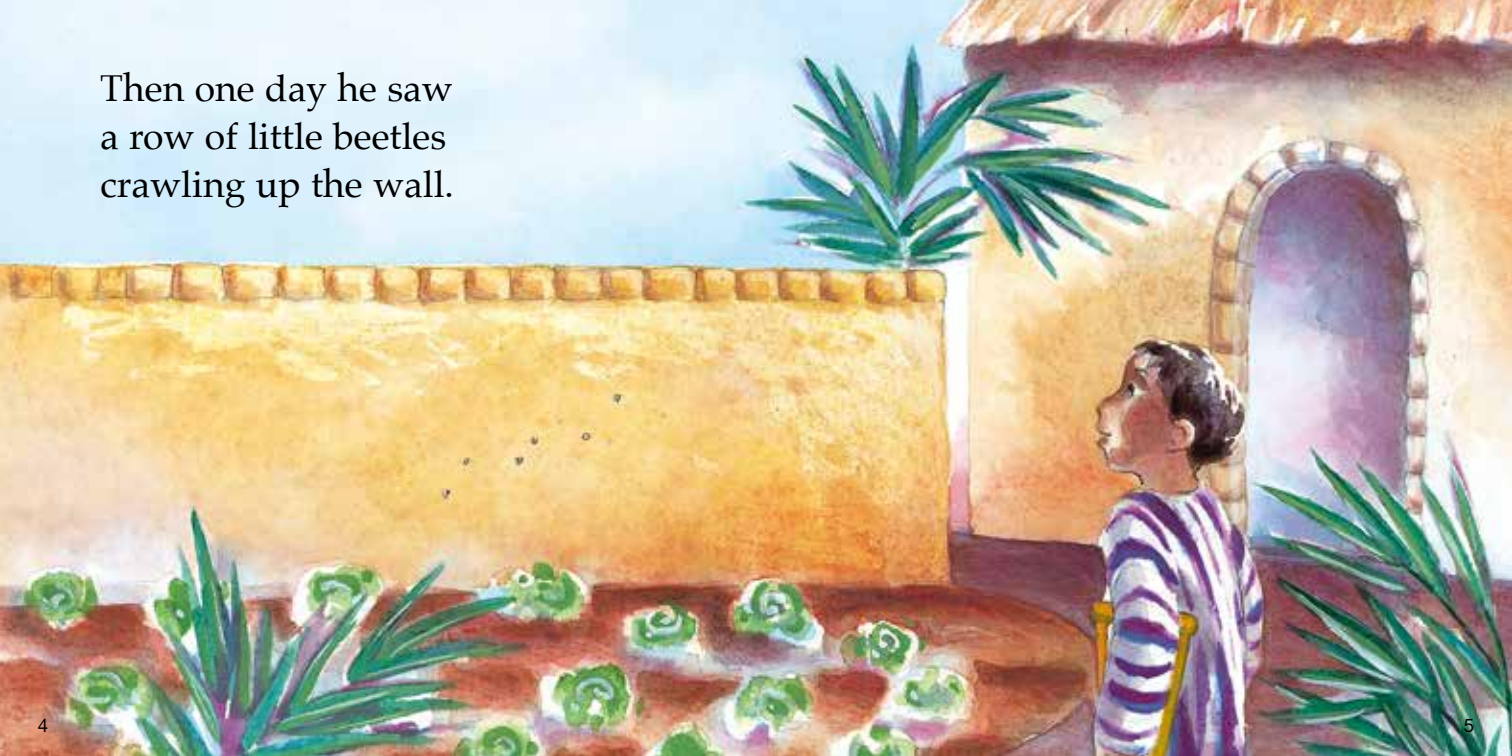
“What is beauty?” Ali asked his mother.

Ali started to count, "One, two, three, four, five, six ugly beetles crawling up, up, up to the top of the wall."

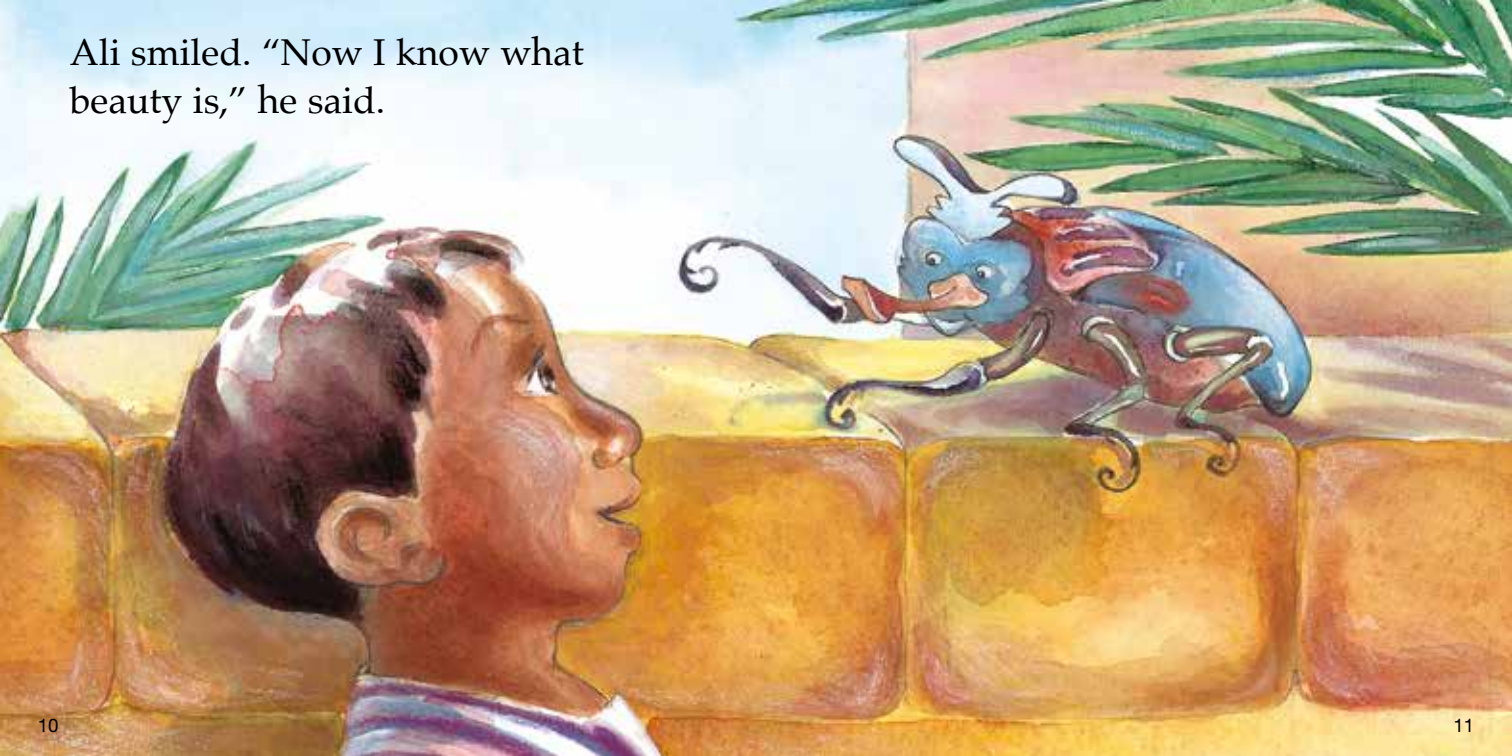


A voice said, "Oh, how beautiful!"
