About the rhyme

This rhyme is about a witch who is cooking at home.

Activities

- Ask your children to suggest what the witch could be frying. Invite them to use playdough to make some of these things and then use them while you say the rhyme together again.
- Play the game 'mirror-mirror'. Sit in pairs facing each other. Make different facial expressions – for example: wink, scrunch up your face, stick out your tongue, open your eyes wide, open your mouth wide. Invite your child to be 'the mirror' and copy what you do. Then let your child make the facial expressions for you to copy.
- Draw a picture of your family. Ask your child to name each person in the picture. Write the name of each person on the picture – or invite your child to do this.
